Mayor's Corner
June 1, 2023

As I write this newsletter, I am amazed at the change in such a short time. Last month we were getting a snow and rain storm weekly. The snow was slow to start flowing. We worried if we would have enough sand bags. We have been very fortunate and blessed with the temperatures rising to the mid 70's and low 80's a couple of days and then cooling down. The mid-level snow is gone and the water flow in the creek has leveled off at approximately 3'- 6" in the park bridge. We had a peak of nearly 5' when we had a warm spell and rain storm. Our preparation was sufficient and the help was appreciated by all.

We still need to be vigilant with everyone and especially children with regard to the 12 Mile Creek. A week ago, I was checking the water flow at the park bridge just before dark. There were 4 youngsters (under 12) on small mini motorbikes riding between the park and the order. Only one bike had a head lamp. One of them stopped and leaned through the bridge rail to watch the water flow. It was extremely difficult to see them. Parents, you are responsible to teach you kids proper bike safety.

Spring and summer make us all want to get outside and ride motorcycles, 4 wheelers and side by sides around town and out of town. Everyone, adults and children must complete a training and receive a new OHV Education Certificate issued by the state. Requirements for adults (over 18) and those under 18 are different. This is administered by the Utah Division of Outdoor Recreation, which is under the Utah Department of Natural Resources. Please look this up on line and get your OHV Operators Certificate.

Another aspect of OHV operation and even vehicles is speeding on town streets. Remember when you are on any street you are driving past someone else's front yard. They may have young children, or pets or even people walking on the street. We have had complaints of people speeding through town. This list includes vehicles, motorcycles, 4 wheelers, side by sides. Speed limits apply to all roads in town, and Cemetery Road, Canyon Road, Park Road, state highway to the end of the Mayfield Estates. No Racing, and No Wheelies. We have Noise ordinances and we can hear your motorcycle all through town.

This past legislative session, there were 44 bills passed that related to land use, zoning and development code modifications. There is a timeline to implement these changes and we will be looking at them.

We are in the middle of setting the new budget for Fiscal Year 2024. Municipalities fiscal year go from July 1st to June 30th. We will be holding a public hearing regarding the budget, watch for the announcement. Last year we had a Truth in Taxation public hearing which resulted in a significant increase in property tax. We informed those at the meeting that we were committed to open and thorough accounting of all town funds and expenditures. We need an informed citizenry and it is your right to know.
